hat a year it was! Despite the challenges of an unprecedented pandemic, Project ARTstART built upon lessons learned in 2020-21, including remote and hybrid training, as well as a return to in-person teaching in classrooms and at the Museum.

In the fall, Claremont High School students (ARTstARTers) toured the CLMA exhibition Furious Garden, made art with artist C.J. Jilek, and prepared projects inspired by her work. They visited Ruth Chandler Williamson Gallery's LA EDGE exhibition, Pomona College's Studio Art Hall for printmaking with art professor Mark Allen, and the dA Center for the Arts to see Scrambled, featuring the works of CGU-trained surrealist Atilio Pernesco. Later in the year, ARTstARTers met Salim Moore, curator of Known & Understood, at the Benton Museum of Art. ARTstARTers also returned to offering in-person AfterARTs sessions at all elementary schools under the supervision of Project Associate Ariana Mungia.

Over the winter, ARTstARTers met regularly to plan art lessons related to the CLMA exhibition *John Frame:*Mephistopheles and the Swan Girl. After touring the exhibition with the artist, they presented their pre-visit, museum-visit, and post-visit art lessons to 4-6 graders. Elementary students from Mountain View, Oakmont, Sumner/Danbury, Sycamore and Vista del Valle then had the

opportunity to visit CLMA and make their own art projects.

In April, ARTstARTers selected and installed elementary student artwork in the Museum's Baldonado Atrium Gallery. That same month, the popular ARTStation returned to offer creative activities at CLMA on the first Sunday of every month for Free Family Day.

To conclude the year, ARTstARTers took an enrichment trip to The Broad Museum of Art in Los Angeles.
